WHAT IS UCAS?



University and Colleges Admissions Service - www.ucas.com

- Processes applications for full-time courses at Higher Education institutions in the UK
- Provides online support, information and guidance to students

Application cost: £27.50



THE UCAS PROCESS 2024



Students create one online application for all courses for which they are applying.

The student completes the majority of the application, including:

- Personal Details
- Choices
- Education
- Employment
- Personal Statement

The Progress Tutor completes the final section – the Reference and Predicted Grades

All applications go through a thorough checking process.

CHOICES



- Students can apply for a maximum of **five** choices
- Choices ordered alphabetically on UCAS

There are some choice restrictions:

- Medicine, Veterinary & Dentistry (4 choices)
- Oxford **OR** Cambridge

The choices should institutions that the student would actually like to attend.

Important to check the entry requirements before applying

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS



- Important to check the entry requirements including specific subjects and GCSE requirements
- Some courses will require students to sit admissions tests and it is the student's responsibility to book/apply for those
- Some courses will require students to attend an interview or submit a portfolio
- Students are made offers based on predicted grades students to liaise with teachers for individual predicted grades

EDUCATION



Students need to input their former schools and previous qualifications.

They will need the following information:

- Full Qualification Title
- Grade Awarded
- Exam Board

It may be useful to have their certificates to hand when completing this section.

Students will also list KGV and their current qualifications, stating the grade as 'pending'.

PERSONAL STATEMENT



The personal statement is the student's chance to market themselves individually on their UCAS application and is written with guidance and support from Progress Tutors.

Students write **one** personal statement that covers **all choices** and is a major part of the selection process by universities.

It should be a thought-out, planned and well-written piece and include:

- Reasons for subject/course choice
- Wider reading/study
- Skills and qualities
- Achievements and relevant experience

Maximum length is 4000 characters or 47 lines

SENDING APPLICATIONS



- Once students have fully completed their sections of the application, they can click 'Pay/Send'. This means that the application is sent to the college – NOT UCAS!
- Progress Tutors will then complete the student's reference and undertake several checks
 of the application before officially submitting the form to UCAS an application can take
 several weeks to get through the whole checking system.

Students **MUST** meet the KGV internal submission deadline to guarantee their application will be checked and sent off before the official UCAS deadline

REFERENCE





Enter a general statement about your school/college/centre.



If applicable, enter any information about extenuating circumstances which may have impacted the applicant's education and achievement.



Outline any other supportive information specific to the applicant and relevant to the course (s) applied for that you think universities/colleges should be aware of.

OXBRIDGE



- Oxford and Cambridge are the two of the most highly regarded universities in the world, and therefore places are highly competitive
- Entry requirements are range from AAA A*A*A*
- You apply to Oxford OR Cambridge, not both
- For students interested in applying to these institutions, we have provided a range of opportunities for them to gain a greater understanding about the process and expectations



DEADLINES



EARLY ENTRY

- Personal statement draft deadline Monday 18th September
- Internal Application deadline Monday 2nd October
- External UCAS deadline Monday 16th October

MAIN SCHEME

- Personal statement draft deadline Monday 2nd October
 - Internal Application deadline Monday 27th November
 - External UCAS deadline Wednesday 31st January

STUDENT FINANCE



The Student Loan is divided into two parts:

- Tuition Fee Loan
- Maintenance Loan

How much Maintenance Loan a student receives depends on:

- Where they chose to live while studying
- Where they are studying
- Household income

Applications will open end of February 2024

STUDENT FINANCE



Applications will open around the end of February 2024



HIGHER AND DEGREE APPRENTICESHIPS



Higher apprenticeships go from level 4 to 7 and are equivalent to a foundation degree and above. Degree apprenticeships are available at levels 6 and 7 and are equivalent to a full bachelor's and Master's.

They combine work with study and may include a work-based, academic or combined qualification or a professional qualification relevant to the industry.

The benefits of a degree apprenticeship include:

- You won't need to pay tuition fees. You will graduate without any student-fee debt.
- You will earn a living while you learn and develop your skills.
- The knowledge you acquire will be practical and applied.
- Your prospects are good.
- -Applications open in September.
- -We recommend students actively research these at the start of the year.

Now is the time to start thinking about progression routes.
