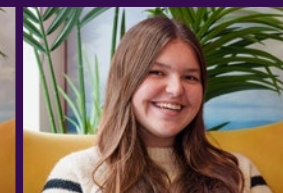

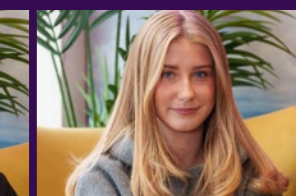

By bus

There are buses from across the area that stop right outside the College. Don't forget to apply for your free travel pass*.

By car

Learning to drive is an important milestone for many of our students and if once you have passed your test you are fortunate enough to have your own car, then you will be pleased to know we have free onsite student parking available to all.

You just need to contact the Student Information Team to get your parking permit.

By bike

Cycling is a brilliant way to get to college, environmentally sound, low cost and a fab workout at the same time! Almost the whole of Southport and out as far as Scarisbrick can be reached from College within 15 minutes by bike and so lots of our students travel this way, particularly during the spring and summer months.

We have a number of bike sheds around the campus for you to store your bike and as always, we recommend that all bikes are secured with a good quality locking system.

By motorbike

Students are welcome to ride their mopeds/motorbikes to College.

You will need to complete a parking form so that we have your details on record, but you're not required to display a permit.

100 1926-2026

It All Started in 1926

In 1926, special permission was granted by Whitehall to rename the Southport Municipal School for Boys in honour of the King. Later that year, the school moved into brand new buildings on Scarisbrick New Road and was officially reopened in October by Lord Derby as King George V Grammar School.

A century later, we are incredibly proud to be celebrating 100 years of educational excellence at KGV, honouring our rich history while continuing to look confidently towards the future.

Creating a College

In 1979, the grammar school was renamed to King George V College, with girls joining the sixth form. In 1982 a brand new modern campus was built and the college became purely a specialised Sixth Form provider, in the format it continues to this day.

Summer of 1997 saw another exciting chapter, when a new building was officially opened by the new Lord Derby. Today, this building is home to our Reception, Humanities Faculty and fantastic Study Hub.

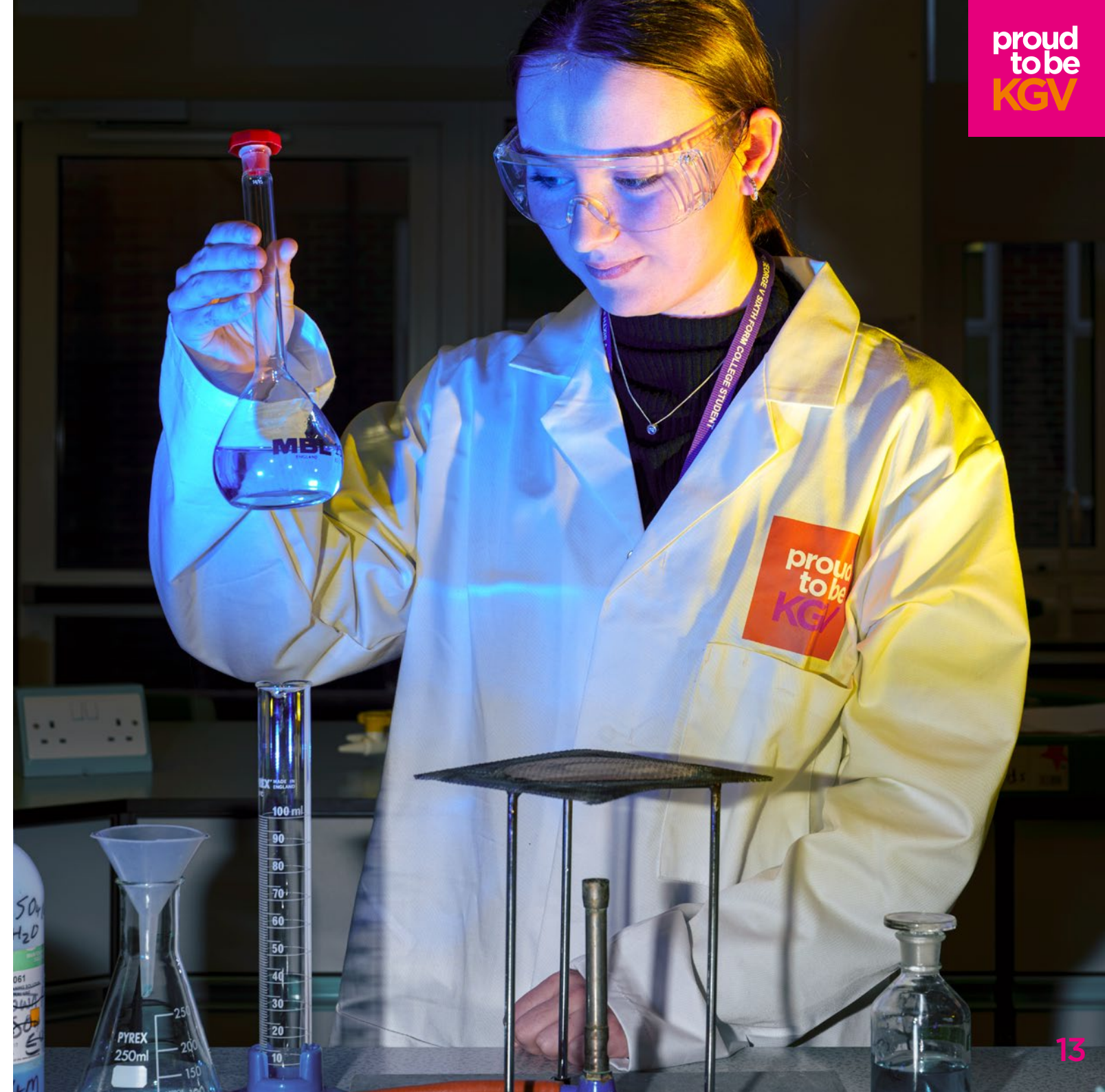
In June 2015, we proudly opened our wonderful Creative Arts building. Housing amazing studios for art, computing, graphic design, photography and textiles, plus a dark room, music suite, drama studio, dance studio and The George Theatre. It is also the proud home of our newest music and performing arts offering; The Academy.

For many years, we have been affectionately known as 'KGV'. So in 2022, we decided to make this official, becoming 'KGV Sixth Form College'. 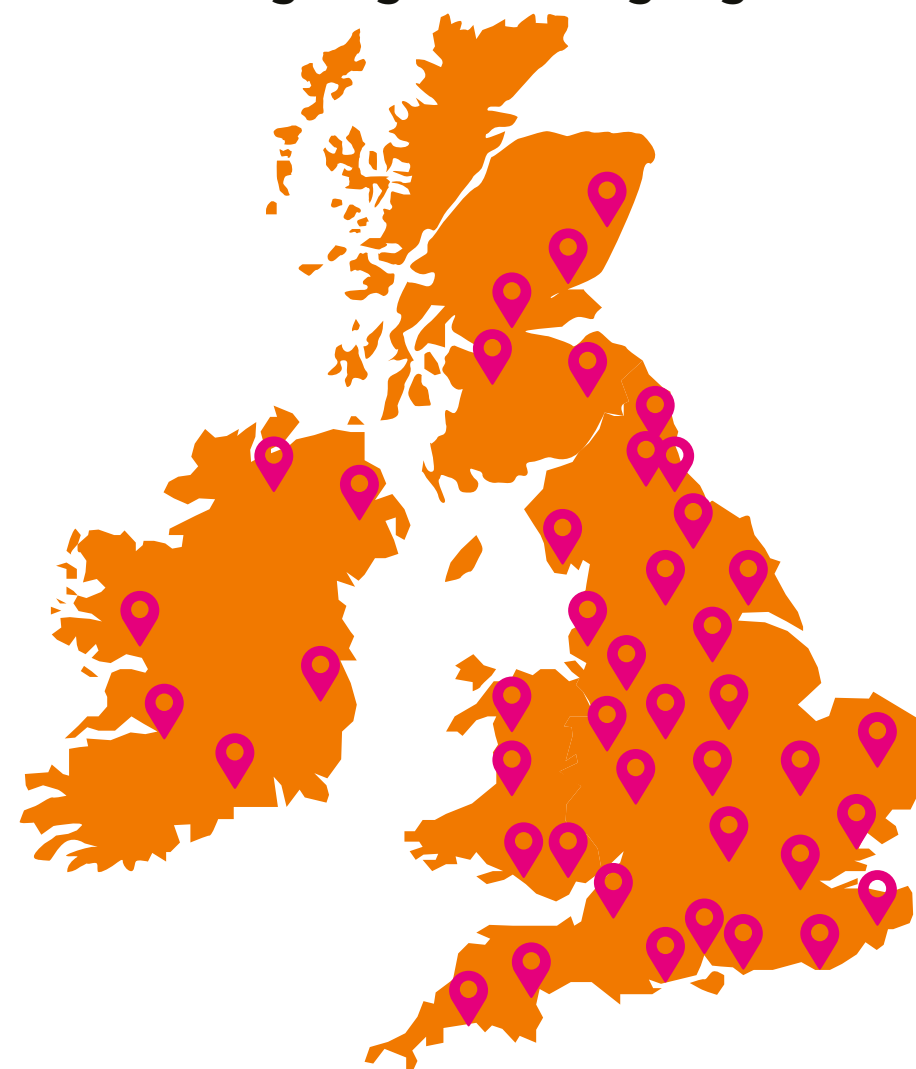

All our students finish half day on Fridays.

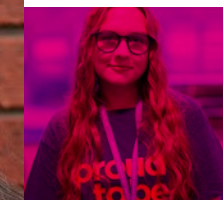

The Duke of Edinburgh Award is a recognised mark of achievement respected by universities and employers all over the world.

An EPQ will develop your independent study skills and will help you stand out when applying for university or a future career.

The Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) is an opportunity to expand your learning by embarking on a self-directed project on a topic of your own choice. It can help you achieve up to an additional 28 UCAS points on top of your results.

To acquire this formal qualification, you need to plan, research and develop an initial idea into a project which will take form in a research based written report. This can be accompanied by a production (charity event, fashion show, sports event, etc) or an artefact (piece of art, computer game, etc).

The EPQ gives students the chance to be creative and curious.

Although your project may be directly related to your main study programme, it doesn't have to be and you can explore concepts outside your course choices.

This develops your independent study skills and will help you stand out when applying for university or a future career.

2 Apply online

We offer you the biggest choice of advanced level courses in the area and the opportunity to build a study programme of qualifications individually tailored to your future aspirations and preferred method of learning.

A-Levels

A-Levels are academic qualifications that are highly valued by universities and employers. They're primarily assessed by exams at the end of two years of study. Each A-Level is worth up to 56 UCAS points depending on your final grade. These points can be used towards university entry. The majority of students choose to study three A-Levels, however if you achieve all 7s or above at GCSE, you may request to study four.

Entry requirements

- Five GCSEs at Grades 9 - 5 including English Language or maths at Grade 4 or above.
- Some courses also have additional requirements. Please see the individual course pages for details

Level 3 BTEC Extended Diploma and T Level

Level 3 Extended Diplomas and T Levels are vocational qualifications that will give you both theoretical and hands on practical experience. They are assessed through a mixture of coursework and external assessment and the qualification you receive is equivalent to three A-Levels and can be used for entrance to university.

Entry requirements

- Five GCSEs at Grade 9 - 4 including maths or English.

Mixed Study Programme

KGV is one of the few colleges in the region to offer mixed study programmes. This individually tailored option allows you to combine A-Levels with V-Levels and equivalents, playing to your strengths and interests.

Students choosing Music, Dance or Drama @ The Academy can combine 2 or 3 of these UAL subjects together or choose one as part of a broader A-Level programme.

V-Level and equivalent courses are each worth up to the same UCAS points as A-Levels (or 1.5 A-Levels in the case of UAL Dance, Drama or Music) and valued at universities across the country. Practical assessment features more predominantly throughout the course with fewer exams.

Entry requirements

- Two GCSEs at Grade 5 or above and three GCSEs at Grade 4 or above, including maths or English.
- Students choosing Dance, Drama or Music will also need to pass a successful audition in their chosen subject(s).

A-Level Foundation Programme

A one year programme designed for students who aspire to study A-Levels but don't quite have the necessary GCSEs yet.

Entry requirements

- Four GCSEs at Grade 4 including maths or English, plus maths or English at Grade 3.

Level 2 Courses

A one year vocational course, designed to give you the qualifications to enable you to progress to the corresponding Level 3 Course or T Level.

Entry requirements

- One GCSE at Grade 4 and two GCSEs at Grade 3 including maths or English.

GCSE maths and English

To qualify for a study programme at you must achieve:

- At least a pass (Grade 4) in either GCSE maths or English and at least a Grade 3 in the other. To progress to university or employment you will need to have passed both.
- So, if when you join us you haven't quite managed this, we will enrol you on the relevant GCSE course alongside your study programme.

Ancient History

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 5 in English (Language or Literature).

Ancient History is the fascinating study of the political, military and social history of ancient Greece and Rome, from which much of the concepts of the modern world were developed: including imperialism, democracy, nationalism and “the state.” The course uses archaeological evidence, such as coins, statues, buildings and inscriptions, as well as studying the works of Greek and Roman historians including Herodotus, Thucydides and Plutarch.

Why you should choose KGV

Our Ancient History course is one of the longest established in the North West and over the years has won several awards for excellent teaching and outstanding results.

All our Ancient History students have membership to the “Southport and Birkdale Classical Association” enabling you to attend talks by leading historians, authors and archaeologists. Plus, our excellent links with the Atkinson Museum enable you to enjoy exclusive behind the scenes tours and can help you gain work experience on archaeological digs.

What you will study

The first year looks at Ancient Greece with a period study which covers fifth century Greece, including causes and outcomes of the Greco Persian and the Peloponnesian Wars. We then switch to Imperial Rome and study the 5 Roman Emperors.

In the second year we look at Alexander the Great and the city of Macedon and then examine the fascinating Roman Republic, as it was, in greater depth.

University destinations and potential careers

A-Level Ancient History could help you progress to degrees in many fields. Recent students have progressed to Chester, Royal Holloway, Manchester and Leicester universities to study a variety of courses including Ancient History, Archaeology and Classics. Future careers can include heritage management, museum curation, archaeology and researcher.

Plus, with the skills you develop in questioning and building persuasive arguments, you can even progress to fields such as politics or law.

Classical Civilisation

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 5 in English (Language or Literature).

Classical Civilisation is the study of Greek and Roman culture, history, society and religion, explored through literature, drama, art and architecture. This fascinating course provides a great mixture of mythology, religion, poetry, philosophy, social history, archaeology and art history. The societies of these great civilisations still have a big impact on our lives today, influencing our legal system and politics, as well as the basis of many popular films and computer games.

Why you should choose KGV

We have one of the longest established Classics courses in the North of England and continually achieve some of the best results in the country, with high percentages of students regularly achieving Grades A*-C. Plus all our Classics students have membership to the “Southport and Birkdale Classical Association” enabling you to attend talks by leading historians, authors and archaeologists.

What you will study

Each year you study 2 modules:
The first year covers “*The Odyssey*”, which tells the tale of Odysseus. You will then delve into Greek Theatre and explore the beginnings of theatre using archaeological evidence and plays including “*Oedipus*”, “*Bacchae*” and “*Frogs*”.

The second year encompasses “*The Aeneid*” and “*Love & Relationships*”.

The “*Aeneid*” was written by Virgil, to rival Homer’s Iliad and please Emperor Augustus and tells the story of Aeneas seeking asylum for his people in Italy.

For “*Love & Relationships*” we read the works of Sappho, Plato, Seneca and Ovid; which cover lesbian love-poetry; a manual to help Romans pick potential partners and philosophical discussions about the place of love within society.

University destinations and potential careers

A-Level Classical Civilisation is not only great for progressing to a degree in Classics; it can also lead to a wider variety, such as Archaeology, History, Journalism and even unrelated fields like Medicine. You could progress to careers in law, business, journalism, politics, museum studies, teaching and much more

Business

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 5 in an essay based subject.

If you want the foundations for a commercial career or you dream of becoming the next Deborah Meaden or Steven Bartlett, by studying Business you can develop the fundamental skills that you need to succeed.

Why you should choose KGV

Our Business teachers at KGV Sixth Form College will provide you with exciting and rewarding lessons, bringing their own wide-ranging experience, both in teaching and in industry. Having all worked in successful businesses, they are able to expand and elaborate on the theoretical learning by applying it to real-life examples.

As a business student, you will also benefit from many opportunities for learning outside the classroom, with guest speakers and visits to working businesses.

Finally, with excellent pass rates, consistently high grades and valuable employability skills, it is no surprise that our students go on to do some wonderful things.

What you will study

Based on giving you a complete range and insight in to the business industry, the course covers four themes and is assessed by three exams at the end of the two years.

You will also develop the skills you will need to succeed with the demands of undergraduate study and the world of work.

The four key themes are:

Business

Standard entry requirements:
Two GCSEs at Grade 5 and three GCSEs at Grade 4 including English Language.

Choosing an A-Level Equivalent means you will undertake fewer exams as your overall grade will also be based upon coursework and practical assessments.

Why you should choose KGV

The content of the qualification is assessed by coursework, controlled assessment and an external exam. We develop your organisational and research skills as well as exploring a wide range of business concepts.

Real business case studies are used for each assignment and current world events are applied, discussed and debated. Teachers on the course have many years of teaching experience, but have also all worked in business previously, which provides a true perspective into the commercial world.

As part of your study programme, trips are built in so that you are able to experience companies such as Jaguar Land Rover and visit places like Liverpool One. In addition to this, regular guest speakers are invited in to provide an insight into real business activities and help demonstrate the career paths that could be available following on from college or university.

What you will study

This course is for students who are interested in learning about the business sector together with other fields of study. It involves units that examine business structures and the external environment, investigate personal and business finance and enable you to design a marketing campaign.

There is also the choice of optional units in areas involving human resources, market research, customer service or law. In conjunction with all topics, we will develop your interpersonal, communication and problem-solving skills.

Business Management & Leadership

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 5 in an essay based subject.

The new T Level is developed in collaboration with employers and businesses so that the content meets the needs of industry and prepares you for a successful career.

Why you should choose KGV

You will be based in our brand new business study zone and boardroom, designed to resemble a real office environment. There is specialist IT equipment to support your learning and help you submit assignments. With our industry experienced and highly qualified teaching team, you will also develop key personal skills, such as team working, research, organisation and communication.

What you will study

This fascinating course deals with how real life businesses are making decisions today and focuses on genuine case studies. You will cover how businesses operate, people management, finance, leadership, team building, change and project management, as well as looking at the legislation that impacts organisations. You will gain an understanding of all elements involved in running a business and the depth of knowledge to start your career.

The T Level mixes classroom learning and “on-the-job” experience, with all students undertaking a valuable industrial placement for a minimum of 315 hours over the duration of the two year course. One T Level is the equivalent of three A-Levels and will give you the skills and UCAS points needed to study a related subject at university, as well as the foundations to pursue a career in a wide range of business functions.

Economics

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 6 in Maths

Studying Economics will help you develop key skills in analysis, problem-solving and numeracy. By applying economic principles to real-world events, like global finance and policy, you'll prepare for a variety of careers in fields ranging from finance and business to government and research.

Why you should choose KGV

Our Business and Economics teachers pride themselves on providing an insightful and challenging experience. They achieve this because of their own extensive experience, both in teaching and in industry. Working in business environments prior to entering teaching enables them to expand and elaborate on the theoretical learning by applying it to many real-life examples that they have witnessed both in and out of the workplace and gives you real invaluable insight.

What you will study

Economics is the study of society through the behaviour of people, firms and governments, with the aim of understanding and improving well-being and wealth in society. A-Level Economics is divided into two parts: Microeconomics and Macroeconomics.

Microeconomics studies the decisions of individuals and firms to allocate resources of production, exchange and consumption. Microeconomics deals with prices and production in single markets and the interaction between markets.

Macroeconomics focuses on the performance of economies, changes in economic output, inflation, interest and foreign exchange rates and the balance of payments. Poverty reduction, social equity and sustainable growth are only possible with sound monetary and fiscal policies

University destinations and potential careers

Economics prepares you for study at degree level, either for standalone Economics or as part of a joint degree with a wide range of other subjects. It can also lead to higher apprenticeships. Possible careers could include working in financial markets, business management and corporate law.

Maths

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 7 in Maths

At A-level you will focus more on algebra rather than numerical mathematics and branch out into the realms of Calculus, which is an essential skill for areas such as Engineering, Business Studies and Economics.

Why you should choose KGV

KGV offers fantastic mathematics teaching delivered by highly experienced, positive and passionate staff who are experts in their field and we will provide you with all the individually tailored support you need to excel.

We encourage you to work in pairs or bigger groups so as to improve your team working and collaborative skills and our Maths students achieve high grades and go on to achieve great things.

What you will study

A-Level Maths is made-up of three main topic areas:

- **Pure Mathematics** (Algebra, Graphs, Trigonometry and Calculus)
- **Mechanics**
- **Statistics**

The final exams are at the end of the two years and are made-up of 60% pure mathematics, 20% statistics and 20% mechanics.

Choosing Further Maths means you will complete A-Level Maths in your first year and then Further Maths in your second year. You will develop skills on an even deeper level, ultimately gaining extremely sought after skills.

We believe that supporting you personally is key in attaining the grades you want, so that's why we ensure you will get high quality tailored support for your individual needs.

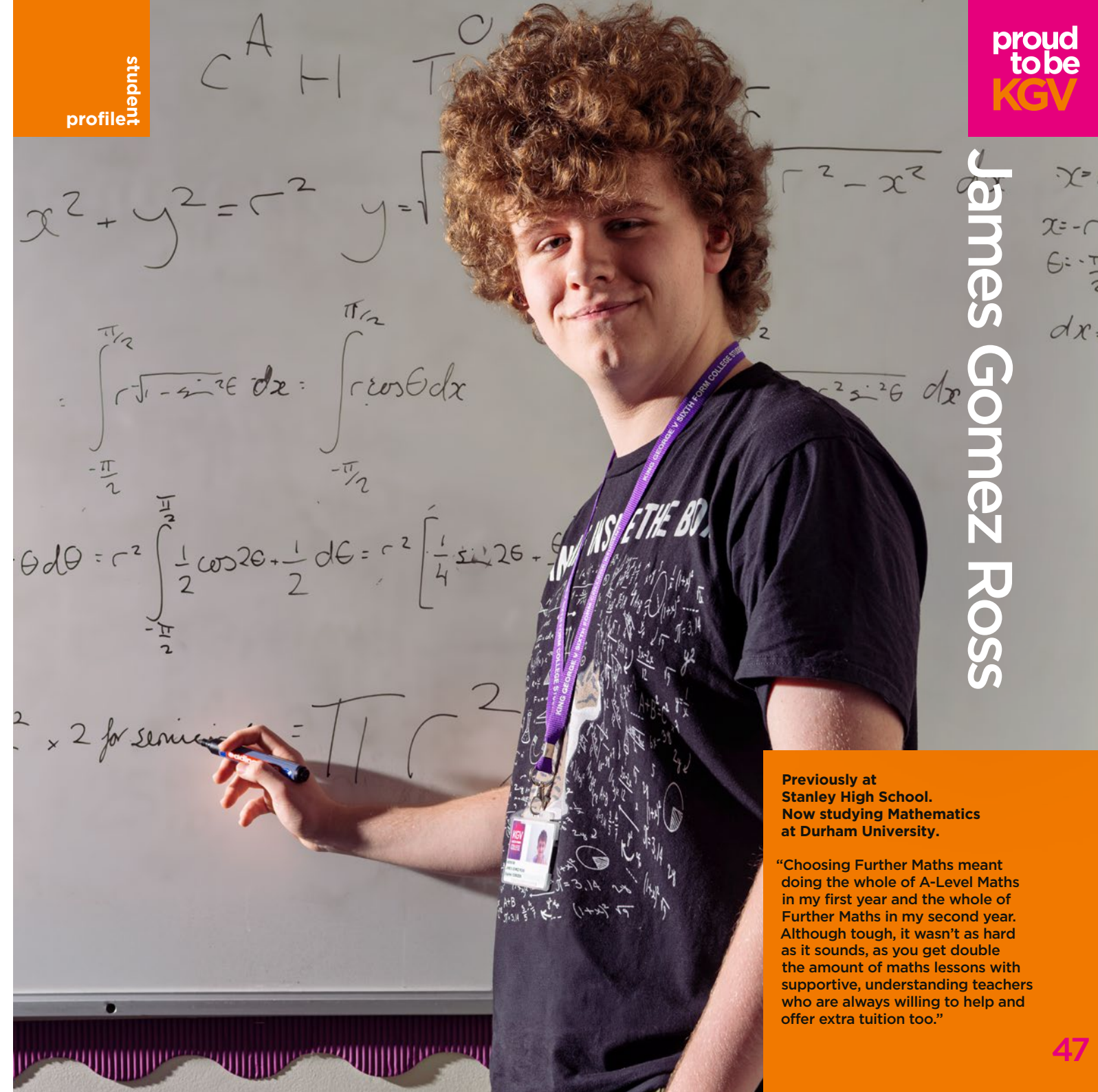

What you will study

The A level Further Mathematics course is made of pure mathematics (algebra, graphs trigonometry and calculus) and a choice of two of the following: Mechanics, Statistics or Discrete Mathematics. Students wanting to study Further Maths, complete the standard A-Level Maths in their first year and progress to Further Maths in their second.

University destinations and potential careers

Mathematicians and statisticians are in demand across a range of sectors as well as a plethora of high level university courses, Further Maths A-Level can then lead to a wealth of employment opportunities including: engineering, finance, banking, accountancy, insurance, medicine, the oil and gas industry and even space science.

Statistics

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 6 in Maths.

A-Level Statistics builds on the Statistics and Probability components of GCSE Maths and is a great choice for students looking to complement subjects such as Business, Psychology, Biology, Geography or Sociology.

Why you should choose KGV

You will be taught by our experienced, engaging maths department, who are subject experts and tailor their lessons to suit your needs. Statistics is a fascinating A-Level and we are one of the few colleges locally that offer it. It will prepare you for a range of disciplines and give you highly sought after problem solving and analytical skills.

What you will study

The course is assessed with 3 exam papers at the end of the 2 years. Topics include:

- Numerical Measures, Graphs & Diagrams
- Probability & Intro to Probability Distributions
- Population and Samples
- Binomial Distribution
- Normal Distribution
- Correlation and Linear Regression
- Bayes Theorem
- Hypothesis Testing
- Goodness of Fit
- Experimental Design
- Exponential and Poisson Distributions

Digital Systems & Data

Standard entry requirements:
Two GCSEs at Grade 5 or above and three GCSEs at Grade 4 or above, including maths or English.

Digital technology shapes almost every aspect of modern life and is transforming the way organisations operate. This exciting new qualification is ideal if you want to develop practical digital skills while keeping your future study and career options open.

Why you should choose KGV

You will investigate how digital systems work, explore the growing importance of data and learn how technology can be used to solve real-world problems. Through practical activities and workplace-related scenarios, you will develop valuable skills in analysis, communication, collaboration, logical thinking and problem-solving.

What you will study

The course combines theoretical understanding with practical application. You will examine how organisations use digital systems, data and emerging technologies to meet the needs of their users and support effective decision-making.

Areas of study will include:

- Digital Systems and Their Components
- Preparing, Analysing and Presenting Data
- Cyber Security Principles and Protocols
- Identifying and Responding to Security Concerns
- Artificial Intelligence and Automated Technologies
- Usability, Accessibility and Inclusive Design
- Ethical and Responsible Use of Digital Technology

You will learn how to prepare and analyse data from different sources, draw justified conclusions and communicate your findings to technical and non-technical audiences. You will also apply security controls, interpret system information and identify potential cyber security threats.

Depending on the pathway offered, you will then develop further practical skills in either:

- Preparing, Configuring and Testing Digital Systems or
- Designing and Creating Digital Solutions to Meet User Needs

University destinations and potential careers

This broad and applied qualification provides excellent preparation for university study, higher or degree apprenticeships and further training in areas such as computing, information technology, data science, cyber security and other digital disciplines.

Politics

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 5 in English (Language or Literature).

Politics is in a constant state of flux. It affects everything in our society and life and is how, why and to whom resources are allocated. Power and decision making are at the heart of politics and if you are interested, intrigued or frustrated by the way the world is run then Politics is for you! You will gain an insight into the nature of politics and how people engage in the political process in the UK and beyond. It encourages you to explore your own views and be challenged by the views of others. Politics is the fastest growing A-Level subject in England and Wales and complements subjects such as Sociology, History, Law, Philosophy, English and Geography.

Why you should choose KGV

You will study highly current topics and themes, which will help you explore and understand the significant changes that impact our lives. Through discussion and debate you will enhance your ability to interpret, evaluate and comment on the nature of politics. You will deepen your understanding of our shared world, acquire knowledge of the structures of authority and power within the political system of the United Kingdom and be encouraged to think more widely about how other political systems may differ and respond to their own challenges.

Students also enjoy enriching trips and visits during their time here and may visit places such as London to visit Parliament and the Supreme Courts, giving primary context to the subjects they have chosen to study.

What you will study

The fascinating course covers a many aspects including:

- **UK Politics and UK Government**
'What powers does the Prime Minister have?'
'Why did Labour win a landslide in 2024?'
'Is Britain truly democratic?'
'What is Brexit all about and why did it happen?'
- **Political Ideas**
Liberalism, Socialism and Conservatism; and the influence of key political thinkers such as Karl Marx, Mary Wollstonecraft and Edmund Burke.
- **Global Politics**
'Can democracy survive global warming?'
'Does China's rise question Western democracy?'

University destinations and potential careers

A-Level Politics is a great platform for studying Law, Philosophy, International Relations, Economics, or History at university; and, as well as a political career, can offer further pathways to research, diplomacy, law and journalism.

History

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 5 in English (Language or Literature).

In modern History we study three key periods. Russia/USSR 1855-1964, Modern Britain 1951-2007 and for the Non-Examined Assessment we consider the events surrounding the European Witchcraze 1550-1660, which is one of our most popular projects. We will teach you how to build persuasive arguments, evaluate contemporary sources and analyse historical interpretations. Studying History A-Level allows you to develop vital skills such as research, literacy and statistical analysis. It is a great launch pad for History degrees or a whole range of related humanities-based degree subjects.

Why you should choose KGV

Come and be part of a thriving, lively and successful department and learn about events that have shaped the world you live in and the people and circumstances that influenced these events. A-Level Modern History is a fascinating yet challenging subject.

You will be looking at fundamental changes/events and analyse why they happened. It is not just an account of the past but an investigation of why things happened the way they did.

Our teachers have over 20 years of teaching and examining experience, so they know exactly how to make sure you get the most out of the course and also the best possible grade.

What you will study

The first year delivers part one of the Russia/USSR unit covering the period of the Russian Tsars from 1855-1917 ending with the rise of the Bolsheviks in November 1917. With reference to Britain, in year one we look at the establishment of the post-war consensus between 1951 and the rise of Thatcher in 1979.

The second year covers more about the rise of Thatcher and also New Labour under Blair. You will also continue the Russian unit, investigating life in Communist Russia and the leaderships of Lenin, Stalin and Khrushchev.

There is also an independent research unit on the European Witch Craze, which is the Non-Examined Assessment.

These fascinating eras provide so much for us to learn and apply to our modern culture. This makes for an interesting dynamic within the classroom, with lots of opportunity to discuss and debate different ideas.

University destinations and potential careers

The department has an excellent record for supporting students with applications to study History at a range of top universities. Recently a number of our students have gained places at St Andrews, Sheffield, Lancaster and Liverpool.

A-Level History could also help you progress to a variety of careers, including Historian, Journalist or Lawyer.

Law

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 5 in English (Language or Literature). This is required because there is a significant amount of extended writing.

Studying A-Level Law will let you explore the relationship between Law, Society and the individual in the United Kingdom.

Why you should choose KGV

Law is everywhere. You can see it when you go to your local supermarket, when you use your phone and even when you go to College. Every item you buy, every agreement you make, every relationship you enter into is regulated by a country's laws.

Our society is governed by laws that supposedly benefit our lives, by studying Law you will learn all about laws, analyse case studies and you will learn to question everything.

At KGV you'll be taught by highly qualified staff, most of whom have also taught in universities. Most notably we have a senior examiner of A-Level Law that teaches on our course. Our staff are knowledgeable and approachable and will teach you the foundations of questioning, a skill which is essential when progressing onto university.

What you will study

If you study A-Level Law at KGV you will have the opportunity to study both public and private law.

This means you will study a variety of different crimes and case studies to give your knowledge a real backing from the past.

Along with this, you will learn about two areas of civil law; contract and tort. You will also consider the bigger picture, examining questions such as 'should law enforce morality?' or 'does law achieve justice?'

University destinations and potential careers

A significant proportion of our Law and Applied Law students go on to study law at university and progress to legal careers. Many go to their first choices, including the University of Leeds, University of Liverpool, Durham University and Edge Hill University.

Applied Law

Standard entry requirements:
Two GCSEs at Grade 5 and three GCSEs at Grade 4 including English Language.

An A-Level Equivalent means undertaking fewer exams as your overall grade is also based on coursework and practical assessments.

Why you should choose KGV

Applied Law allows you to discover how law impacts every aspect of society. You'll consider how laws are made, interpreted and how they affect everyday life.

You will be taught by highly qualified staff, who also have experience of teaching Law at university. Plus both our Applied Law teachers are also examiners for the awarding body Pearson. During the course there is a fascinating trip to the London Central Criminal Court (the Old Bailey) and the Supreme Court of England and Wales, as well as lots of extra-curricular activities including competitions run by leading law firms and visits to local courts too.

What you will study

The course is equivalent to an A-Level and attracts the same UCAS points. The majority of modules are examined by our teachers, however some of them will be externally assessed. It is therefore ideal for students who want to want to study using an element of applied learning, rather than purely exam based assessment. The course covers a variety of different types of law and includes a range of different crimes, including murder, manslaughter and theft offences; as well as negligence and family law. It provides an introduction to the study of the legal sector and also allows you to develop transferable skills which are highly regarded by higher education institutions and employers.

Popular degree courses include:

- Criminology
- Criminal Investigation
- Politics

Studying Law at KGV can help you embark on a variety of careers, including Barrister, Solicitor and Police Officer.

Philosophy

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 5 in English (Language or Literature).

Philosophy translates as ‘love of wisdom.’ Defined as ‘thinking about thinking,’ Philosophy delves into ordinary opinions and convictions on a range of different topics. Philosophy will give you the skills to think logically and critically, skills that are crucial for an examined life. You will be taught, not what to think, but how to think.

Why you should choose KGV

Philosophy at KGV is known for its outstanding performance and high levels of student enjoyment. You can also join the Philosophy Symposium, a weekly debating opportunity, where you can discuss current affairs. Plus, you will have the chance to attend the Philosophy and Religious Studies conference at Lancaster University. This is a great opportunity to listen to experts in different areas of Philosophical interest.

You will enjoy a wide breadth of resources and facilities. This includes conducting philosophical research in our fantastic Study Hub, reading the original texts of Western philosophers and reading articles in the Philosophy Today magazine.

What you will study

Philosophy lessons are characterised by insightful debates which students not only enjoy but also find very thought provoking.

In year one you study:

- **Epistemology**
Do we experience the world as it is or is human perception merely an interpretation of the world? What is knowledge? What can we know and how do we know that we know?

- **Moral Philosophy**
Is there objective moral reality? Are our moral claims mere expressions of our subjective feelings about situations or are they descriptive of a moral reality.
- **In year two you study:**
- **Metaphysics of God**
What is God? Is there a God? Are the attributes of God logically coherent, e.g. can they be reconciled with the existence of evil in the world? Is Religious language meaningful?
- **Metaphysics of Mind**
What is mind? What is the relationship between the mental and the physical? Are the mind and the body separate and can either exist without the other?

University destinations and potential careers

Our previous students have gone on to study a variety of degree courses, with many opting to study PPE (Philosophy, Politics and Economics). However, studying A-Level Philosophy prepares you for the kind of rigorous thinking and critical analysis valued in a wide variety of fields of study and diverse careers.

Sociology

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 5 in English (Language or Literature).

Sociology is the study of how human societies shape the lives of the people who live in them and how these people act, react and interact. The value of a sociological imagination is that the subject opens up the world to you; it aims to challenge and change your thinking. Sociology is a critical and reflective subject grounded in meaningful questioning for why specific institutions and groups are the way they are. If you like to question, debate and delve deep into understanding human relationships and behaviour, then sociology is for you.

Why you should choose KGV

Sociology at KGV enhances your learning in many ways, using a wide range of techniques such as presentations, one-to-ones, group work, documentaries, video clips, creative sessions and personal ICT based research. You will be supported throughout the course enabling you to be successful in your essay writing skills, your ability to develop appropriate and balanced arguments and to critically assess theoretical views. We offer a range of trips and guest speakers to enhance the course. Plus additional support sessions to expand students' knowledge and exam technique as well as giving you access to a wide array of sociology books in the Study Hub.

What you will study

You will explore sociological themes and perspectives, politics, social policy and roles within a number of areas including education, families and households, beliefs in society and crime and deviance. We offer Sociology discussion sessions to help you develop your knowledge of the subject and exam technique.

University destinations and potential careers

Many students have gone on to study Sociology degrees at a range of universities, including Lancaster, Liverpool and Leeds. Others have studied related subject areas such as Criminology at Chester and International Disaster Management at University of Manchester, both of which include a significant proportion of sociological knowledge and skills.

A-Level Sociology prepares you for a diverse range of careers such as Business and Management, Social Work, or the Police Force.

Psychology

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 5 in GCSE English Language (not Literature) and
Grade 5 in GCSE Maths.

Psychology combines scientific methods to study human behaviour and thinking. Combining research, literacy, statistical analysis and critical evaluation skills. Psychology allows you to gain insights about peoples' motivations, perceptions and behaviour. This gives you a different perspective on why people react in the ways they do and can help you to further understand people.

Why you should choose KGV

Teaching takes places in our dedicated psychology classrooms, where you will also find an array of relevant books and resources. Our students enjoy exciting trips and great guest speakers to bring the course to life and our expert teachers offer additional support sessions to perfect your exam technique.

What you will study

The course covers three key topics; an introduction to psychology; psychology in context and issues and options in psychology.

There are also various fascinating sub topics too. Amongst other things you will study memory and consider if juries are reliable; psychopathology, which includes the causes and treatments for mental health disorders and you will look at children's attachment to their caregivers and the impact this can have if it does not occur.

You will gain insight into research methods used by psychologists, including the use of experiments, observations and questionnaires used to understand human behaviour. So if you enjoy finding out about why people behave the way they do then this subject is for you.

University destinations and potential careers

A-Level Psychology could help you progress to a variety of careers, including Clinical Psychologist, Forensic Psychologist, Occupational Therapist or Mental Health Nurse. Recent students have been inspired by the forensic and mental health aspects of the course and have gone on to study degrees in Psychology and Criminology at Liverpool, Manchester and Leeds Universities.

Applied Psychology

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 4 in GCSE Maths.

Choosing an A-Level Equivalent means you will undertake fewer exams as your overall grade will also be based upon coursework and practical assessments. Psychology is the scientific study of the mind and behaviour. If you are fascinated about why people behave the way that they do then this is an ideal course for you.

Why you should choose KGV

You will be taught by highly experienced supportive teachers who are all experts in their field and offer extra sessions to expand your knowledge and encourage independent research. There are inspiring guest speakers and interesting visits, to really bring the content to life. What you will study

Applied Psychology is a BTEC qualification and is equivalent to one A-Level. There are four units, two of which are assessed by external examinations. You will take one exam and one coursework unit at the each year.

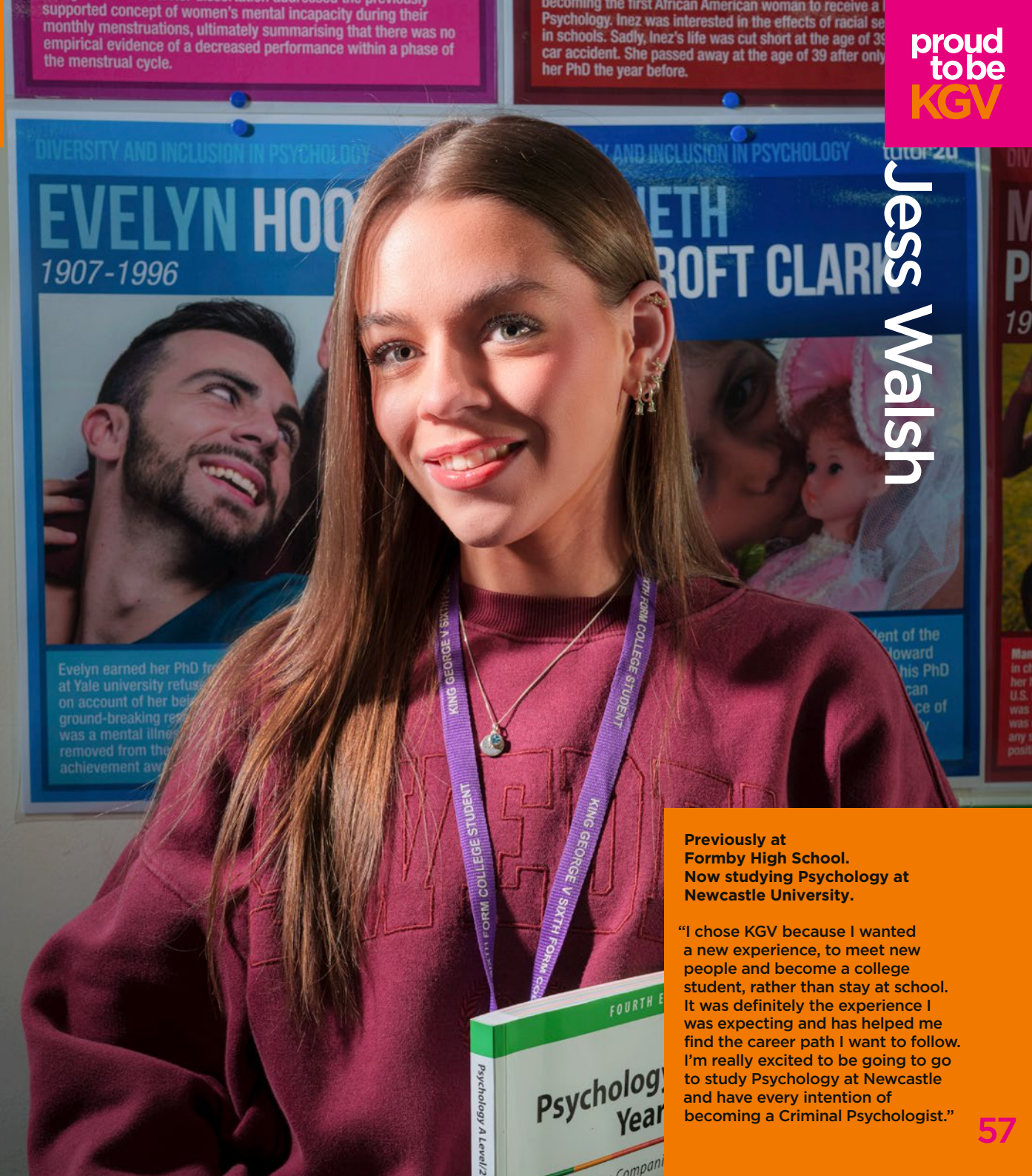
The course covers key psychology approaches, principles and practices. You will learn about social and cognitive psychology, the learning and the biological approach; as well as developing an understanding of how psychological research and concepts can be applied to gender, aggression and consumer behaviour. You will study topics including memory, aggression, stress and addiction that can be applied in the everyday world.

You will discover how to conduct psychological research and you will have the opportunity to conduct your own small investigation.

With Health Psychology you will explore psychological approaches, theories and studies related to lifestyle choices and unhealthy behaviours and discover ways to encourage positive behavioural change. The Criminal and Forensic unit explores the different theories and psychological approaches used to explain criminal behaviour and how this is applied in the criminal justice system.

University destinations and potential careers

Applied Psychology has the equivalent UCAS points of an A-Level and opens up many different options at university including forensics, criminology and clinical psychology. **You can then progress to a range of careers, from clinical psychologist or occupational therapist to detective to name but a few!**

UAL Dance

Entry requirements:
Two GCSEs at Grade 5 and three GCSEs at Grade 4 including English Language. You will also be required to perform a successful audition.

Whether you want to study Dance, Drama or Music, we have the perfect study programme just for you! UALs are 2 year courses which are the equivalent of completing 1.5 A-Levels each. They can either be combined with A-Levels or other UAL courses. They are taught in our fantastic provision 'The Academy'. Once you have applied, you will be invited to an admissions interview to discuss your chosen combination and be given an audition date.

Dance A-Level Equivalent

Developing intense discipline, stamina and professionalism, UAL Dance allows you to play to your strengths and refine your artistry. You will develop a foundation in technique and safe training, that will inform your studies and future ventures.

You will develop a foundation of knowledge of performing and production, that will inform your studies and future ventures.

You will take part in several productions throughout your time at KGV, beginning with a Christmas show and ending in a Final Major Project, covering every aspect of theatre creation. How are you assessed? Your progress will be marked individually for every project, whether as a performer, director, technician or stage manager. Plus, there is no exam! You are assessed in a variety of ways, including workshops, presentations and performances. At the end of your studies, you will have a portfolio of work which will support your future studies and endeavours.

Throughout the year, students across the subjects will take part in public performances, on stage in The George Theatre, in pantomimes, summer showcases and other exciting events. UAL Music

Entry requirements:
Two GCSEs at Grade 5 and three GCSEs at Grade 4 including English Language. You will also be required to perform a successful audition.

Music A-Level Equivalent

UAL Music places a strong emphasis on live performance, allowing you to play to your strengths and build professional stagecraft. You will develop a foundation of knowledge in instrumental technique and music technology, that will inform your studies and future ventures.

You will take part in regular live gigs and showcases throughout your time at KGV, from ensemble performances to recording original studio projects, covering every aspect of music creation. How are you assessed? Your progress will be marked individually for every project, whether as a soloist, band member, songwriter or music technician. The more comfortable and creative you can be, the better.

Assessment is done in a variety of ways, including rehearsals, live performances and recorded work, which means no exams! At the end of your studies, you will have a portfolio which supports progression into education or the industry.

University destinations and potential careers

Criminology

Standard entry requirements:
Two GCSEs at Grade 5 and three GCSEs at Grade 4 including English Language.

A-Level equivalent in Criminology is a fascinating qualification with elements of psychology, law and sociology, perfectly complementing studies in other humanities based subjects.

Why you should choose KGV

Your course teachers have many years experience and a real passion for the subject. Plus, you will benefit from dedicated teaching spaces, access to up-to-date IT facilities and a wealth of research materials.

There is an opportunity to progress to study a wealth of related degree subjects, or alternatively the qualification will allow you to gain the required understanding and skills needed for employment within the criminal justice system including the National Probation Service, the Courts and Tribunals Service or the National Offender Management Service.

What you will study

Year 1 comprises 2 units. The first will focus on understanding different types of crime, influences on perceptions of crime and why some crimes are unreported. Following this, in Unit 2, you will gain an understanding of why people commit crime, drawing on what you have covered in Unit 1.

In year two you will study a further 2 units. The first is 'Crime Scene to Courtroom', which provides an understanding of the criminal justice system from the moment a crime has been identified to the verdict.

You will develop the understanding and skills needed to examine information in order to review the justice of verdicts in criminal cases.

Your final unit 'Crime and Punishment', focuses on applying your understanding of the awareness of criminality, criminological theories and the process of bringing an accused to court, in order to evaluate the effectiveness of social control to deliver criminal justice policy.

The 'applied' focus of this qualification makes it exciting, helping to broaden your mind as all learning is applied to real life situations and case studies on a national and global level.

Each year comprises one internal controlled assessment and one examination.

University destinations and potential careers

Criminology is an ideal subject for students looking to progress on to a wide variety of degree courses, including:

- Criminology
- Criminal Justice
- Psychology
- Law
- Sociology

Criminology also opens up a range of career paths including: Solicitor, Probation Officer or Police Officer.

English Literature

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 5 in both English Literature and English Language.

English Literature is a subject that has wide-ranging significance to the world beyond KGV. Studying literary texts encourages students to think analytically and look at ideas and issues from different perspectives. The diversity of the texts studied helps students to develop an understanding of a range of historical periods and other cultures. These skills are important for so many different careers and especially for undergraduate study.

Why you should choose KGV

English Literature at KGV will allow you to experience a plethora of literary texts in an in-depth way. The set texts have been chosen by the teachers to offer a diverse learning experience, which helps students to develop their knowledge of a range of genres from a broad period of time; from Shakespeare to Carol Ann Duffy. As part of the study of English Literature we interpret texts from a range of perspectives such as Marxist, Feminist and Psychoanalytical. All of which helps students to develop valuable critical and analytical skills, as well as a comprehensive knowledge of some of the most prominent writers and genres in English Literature.

What you will study

In Year 1, you will study 4 texts: 2 of these will be the novels, Jane Eyre by Charlotte Bronte and The Remains of the Day by Kazuo Ishiguro, two very different texts from differing time periods. You will study 1 play and this will be the American modern tragedy, A Streetcar Named Desire by Tennessee Williams. You will also study a collection of poetry called Meantime, by Carol Ann Duffy.

In Year 2, you will study a further set of texts A Shakespeare play, either Hamlet or The Tempest, a further play, The Duchess of Malfi by John Webster and a collection of poetry by Philip Larkin. Alongside this, you will be introduced to the skill of unseen poetry and prose extract analysis. Also in Year 2, you will undertake a personal investigation into 2 novels in order to produce the non-exam assessment unit for the course. At the end of your 2 years with us, you will sit 3 exams on the set texts and a selection of unseen texts.

University destinations and potential careers

Students who study English Literature at KGV Sixth Form College have gone on to study a wide range of courses at university, such as English at Oxford, Law at Liverpool and Classical Studies at St Andrews.

A-Level English Literature could help you progress to a variety of careers, including Publisher, Magazine or Newspaper Editor or Creative Writer.

English Language and Literature

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 5 in both English Literature and English Language.

English Language and Literature (Combined) is a unique and distinctive qualification. Students explore the richness of language and literature and cultivate their own critical responses. It involves the study of literary and non-fiction written and spoken texts. The course also enables students to develop their creativity and expertise by producing their own original writing. There is clear continuity from GCSE, but students explore texts of greater variety and challenge and learn to apply linguistic and literary concepts and methods to their analysis of texts.

Why you should choose KGV

You will be based in our wonderful Creative Arts building; with bright spacious classrooms equipped with all the technology you will need. This fantastic learning environment is backed up and supported by the passion of the highly experienced teachers, who captivate and inspire their students, encouraging them to not only develop in the subject, but also as a person. Through this nurturing and aspirational environment you will be able to achieve your dreams and ambitions.

What you will study

You will study new ways of reading and writing about all kinds of text types. Twentieth century writers like Tennessee Williams and Arundhati Roy are read alongside non-fiction texts like letters, podcasts, blogs and graphic novel extracts. You'll explore William Blake's poetry in its historical and social contexts.

By examining new language concepts in action, you will learn how to become an accomplished writer of different kinds of literary and non-literary material.

In terms of assessment, there are three exams where you'll write about your set texts and produce some original writing. There is also one non-examined assessment. For the NEA you have more independence in selecting two texts to compare. You also create another original piece of non-fiction.

English Language and Literature opens up many degree courses and recent students have progressed to prestigious universities including Oxford, Durham and Liverpool to study subjects such as Linguistics, Marketing, Law, Journalism and Criminology. Following on from university the career possibilities are endless and include Speech Therapist, Technical Author, Journalist & Publisher.

English Language

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 6 in English Language (not Literature).

There has never been a better time to study the significance of language. Language can represent who we are and what we value. Our recent past and present tells us that language can be used in very powerful ways. We use it to create our identities, to include others or exclude them, to create unity or destroy it. From the sounds of our accents to the choices we make in sending Instagram messages, we cannot escape the hold that language has over us nor our involvement in the way it is being shaped for the future. This makes studying English Language at A-Level completely different from GCSE.

Why you should choose KGV

Studying English Language at KGV Sixth Form College will give you the confidence to explore, analyse and evaluate the world around you. You will develop your knowledge and skills using leading research and the most up-to-date resources. You will have the opportunity to meet and learn from the people who are at the leading edge of the subject and who write the textbooks. The course is made up of three assessments: two examinations and a piece of coursework.

For the first exam paper on the Individual and Society, you will be taught language levels of lexis, semantics, grammar and pragmatics to enable you to analyse and compare representations of topics across a range of different text types.

In the second paper on Diversity and Change, you will learn how age, region, gender, sexuality, occupation, social group and ethnicity can influence language. You will also study English as a global language and the ways in which language changes. The final aspect is a non-examined assessment that comprises a language investigation and a piece of original writing.

University destinations and potential careers

English Language A-Level is recognised by every university as an excellent step towards further study. Courses in Language or Linguistics are natural progressions, with potential career paths in Forensic Linguistics, Marketing and Speech and Language Therapy.

Recent students have gone on to study a diverse range of subjects such as: Copywriting and Publishing, Journalism, Law and Criminology at prestigious universities that include Oxford, Leeds and King's College London.

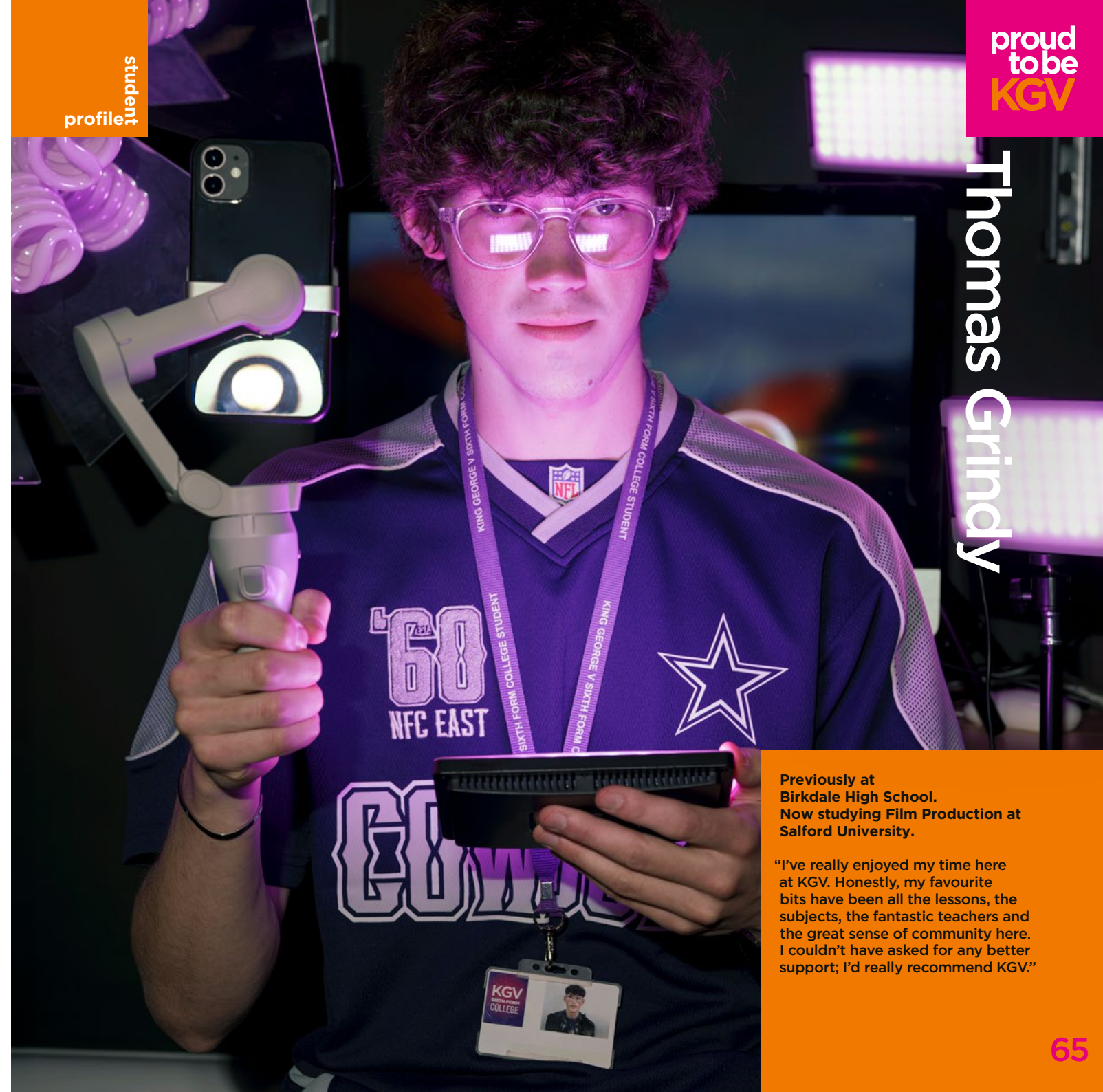

Geography

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 5 in English (Language or Literature).

Geography is a broad based academic subject which will open up many options for you in your future. As a subject linking the arts and the sciences it is highly flexible in terms of what you can combine it with at A-Level. Geography is highly valued by universities as an A-Level choice and is consistently ranked one of the highest graduate employment rates.

Why you should choose KGV

Studying A-Level Geography at KGV Sixth Form College will deepen your understanding of our shared world. You will study current topics and themes to help you explore and understand the significant changes that are beginning to impact our lives, from climate change and Brexit to the friction between the USA and China.

Fieldwork and study trips are an essential part of KGV Geography that will accompany course content and broaden your knowledge. When studying this course, you will take part in several trips, including exploring Liverpool's dockland regeneration and visiting areas where rewilding schemes are taking place.

The course is taught by a highly qualified lecturer, with post graduate research experience and expertise in a number of key course topics.

Students often go on enriching field trips for primary research on both human and natural environments. Trips include visits to places such as Liverpool Waterfront and Welsh Streets, Salford Quays, Hesketh Out Marshes and Little Woollen Moss.

What you will study

We study 8 topics over the two years such as, tectonic processes and hazards, coastal landscapes and change, globalisation, regenerating places, water cycle and water insecurity, carbon cycle and energy security, superpowers and migration, identity and sovereignty.

You will also produce a piece of original research about a theme that you are interested in. Recent titles initiated by students include: 'The impact of Everton's new stadium redevelopment on Walton residents' and 'An investigation into the threats to and management of Sefton's coastline'.

University destinations and potential careers

Recent students have progressed on to study at top universities including Durham, Lancaster, Leeds and Liverpool studying courses such as Geography, Environmental Management and Environmental Science.

A-Level Geography could help you progress to a variety of careers, including Meteorologist, Town Planner or Environmental Consultant and is valued by employers requiring data analysis skills.

Spanish

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 6 in Spanish or Grade 7 in another foreign language.

The political climate throughout the world has changed dramatically in recent years. Consequently, employers in both UK and international job markets need candidates with a clear understanding of different cultures and the ability to communicate confidently and effectively within those cultures. Learning Spanish, the second most spoken native language in the world and the third in terms of total number of speakers, can only boost your job prospects; it provides you with international experience and an empathetic view on the outside world – just the skills many employers are looking for.

Why you should choose KGV

At KGV Sixth Form College you will benefit from learning in a variety of ways and settings, using authentic materials and current media.

Your course teacher is a native Spanish speaker. This opportunity is not to be missed, as the conversation sessions that take place are a fantastic environment to practise and learn in. Furthermore, our fantastic Study Hub provides you with a wide variety of audio books, graded readings adapted to learners of the language, comics and films so that you can explore and learn independently with the resources of your choice.

What you will study

As well as the language, you will explore the history, character and way of living in Spain. You will have the opportunity of studying elements of their art and culture, their traditions, their ideas, but also the tensions and challenges they face as a community in a global world.

The assessment criteria is broken down in to three components, with Speaking weighted 30%, Listening, Reading and Translating worth 50% and Critical Response in Writing making up the remaining 20%.

Grade 4 in an Art and Design based subject*

*Students who are not currently taking an art or design related GCSE may still be accepted for Fashion & Textiles A-Level on successful completion of a set task.

Textiles is a practical and creative subject and you will have the opportunity to explore a wide range of disciplines including printed textiles, fashion, surface pattern and constructed textiles (creative embroidery and knit). You will be introduced to a range of textile processes, technology and resources concerning textile design and textile arts alongside the history of fashion and textile studies.

You will be based in our fantastic Creative Arts building, which has all the facilities and specialist equipment you will need to create amazing professional pieces and is available for you to use both during and outside your specific lesson times. What you will study

Working within a professional environment, you will experience fashion and textiles first hand, exploring techniques such as silk screen printing, fabric dying and embellishment, machine embroidery, batik, devoré, fabric painting and repeat pattern. You will learn how to approach art and design analytically, with research and investigation playing a key role within the A-Level experience.

As part of your assessed portfolio you will curate your own independent fashion show, cat walk experiences and gallery settings. Textile students also have the opportunity to work alongside visiting professional and established artists from the fashion and textile industry.

You will also have the opportunity to participate in national competitions and live briefs which gives experience of working within and meeting real creative industry expectations.

University destinations and potential careers

Fine Art

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 4 in an Art and Design based subject*

*Students who are not currently taking an art or design related GCSE may still be accepted for Fine Art A-Level on successful completion of a set task.

The visual arts are a major part of British industry. This course will give you a head start in developing the creative problem solving skills that you will need. Choosing to study Fine Art will give you the opportunity to work in an expressive and personal way, whilst engaging with both social and cultural issues. Throughout the course you will be expected to develop an open and exploratory approach to your work and to develop your own informed opinions, with an increasing awareness of contemporary issues and industry level practice.

The art department is in our inspiring Creative Arts building and gives you two fabulous spacious and bright fine art studios to work in both during and outside of your lessons. What you will study

This two year A-Level course will cover a broad base of Fine Art, introducing you to a wide variety of possibilities which will help you develop your own practice as an artist.

You will be expected to develop an open and exploratory approach to your work and to develop informed opinions, with an increasing awareness of contemporary issues and industry level practice, as well as exploring commercial and artistic avenues.

Animal Management

Standard Entry Requirements:
Five GCSEs at Grade 9 - 4 including maths or English.

The T Level in Animal Management is a two year study programme designed for students interested in a career working with animals, or the wider animal industry.

Why you should choose KGV

We have a dedicated Animal Management centre with a fantastic purposely created animal unit, which is currently home to a great selection of small mammals and reptiles including rabbits, guinea pigs, bearded dragons, leopard geckos, giant African land snails and royal pythons to name but a few.

Our in house facilities will give you plenty of day to day practical experience with our animals, but we also have close links with lots of external animal centres and businesses, to ensure that you gain regular hands on experience with a wide variety of other animals and animal settings too.

What's more, during the course, you will not only take part in numerous trips and visits and hear from a plethora of interesting speakers from animal focused services, but you will also complete 150 hours of valuable work experience each year, ensuring you finish your course with the skills and experience needed for further study or employment in this highly competitive field.

What you will study

During this fascinating and varied course you will study animal breeding and genetics; animal biology; animal welfare and ethics; practical animal husbandry; animal behaviour and animal health and diseases.

You will also be expected to complete an investigative research project in a relevant topic and to undergo a work placement in the animal sector.

Please note that the course does contain some externally assessed units.

University destinations and potential careers

This course is ideally suited to progressing on to study a variety of animal-related and science degrees such as zoology, animal behaviour, veterinary nursing and conservation science. Some universities will also accept it to progress to study Veterinary Science.

An Animal Management Extended Diploma could lead to a variety of careers including Veterinary Nurse, RSPCA Officer; Zoo Keeper or Animal Sanctuary Manager.

Uniformed Protective Services

Standard Entry Requirements:
Five GCSEs at Grade 9 - 4 including maths or English.

The Level 3 BTEC Extended Diploma in Uniformed Public Services is ideal for students wishing to pursue a career in a wide variety of uniformed Public Service roles. As well as studying elements of law, psychology, politics and policy making, you will also develop the skills, knowledge and experience to help you pursue a career in the Armed Forces, Police, Fire Service, Prison Service, Immigration Service and more.

This exciting course will be taught by a highly experienced department, passionate about their subjects and keen to share their real-life knowledge gained from working in a variety of relevant roles, including Law, the Armed Forces and the Police Service.

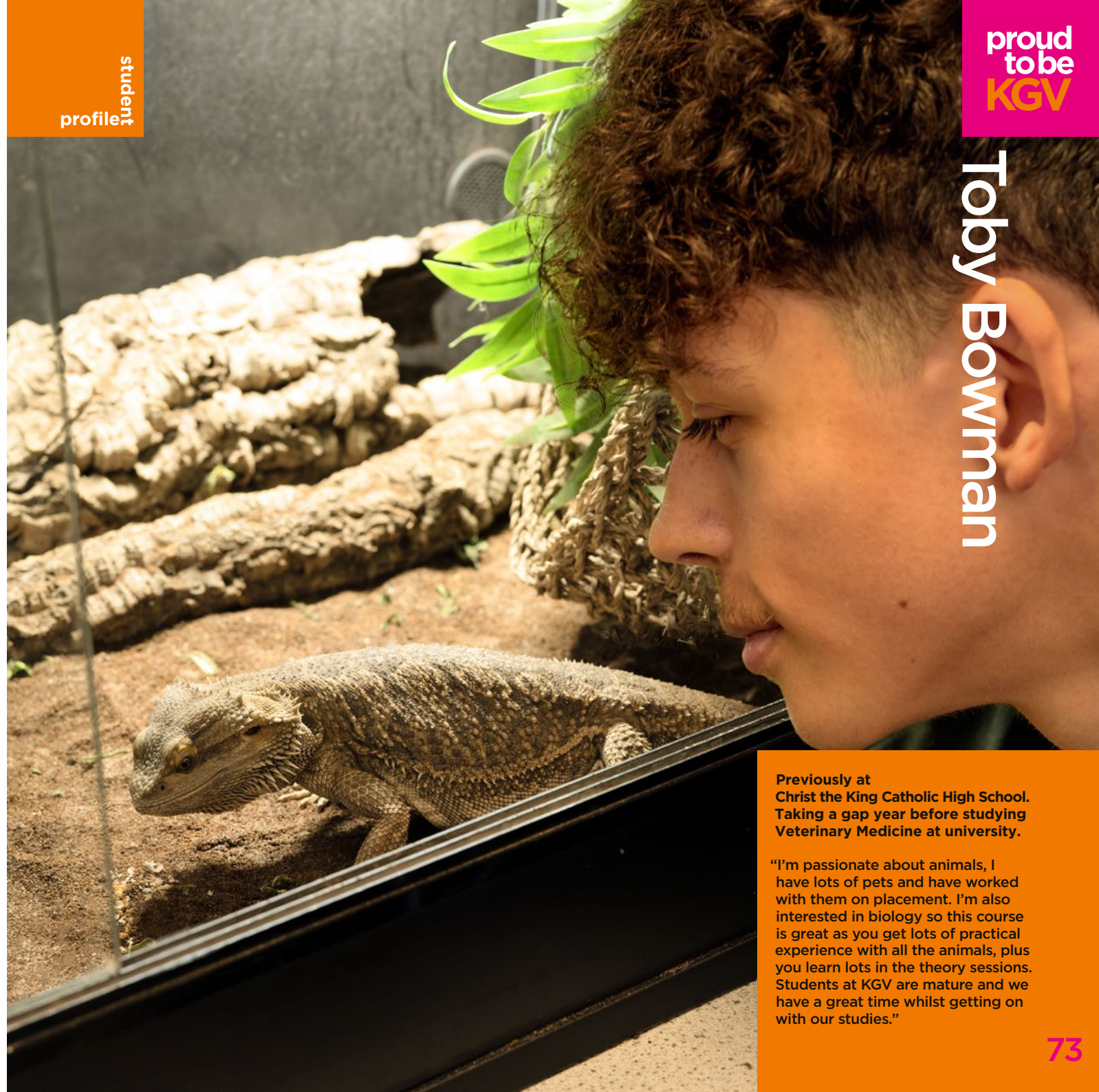

Education

Standard entry requirements:
Two GCSEs at Grade 5 and three GCSEs at Grade 4 including English Language.

If you are dreaming of a career where you can make a real difference in children's lives this is an ideal option when choosing your courses at KGV. We know that working with children is such a rewarding career pathway and this course is a great start.

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 4 in Science.

Applied Science

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 4 in a least one Science.

Applied Science is a brilliant course if you are interested in the scientific principles of biology, chemistry and physics. The course focuses on the fundamental concepts and practical skills of science and then builds your understanding of how they are utilised within the industry.

Applied Science can be studied alongside both science and non-science subjects, but to further support your subject knowledge, it is recommended that you combine this course with either Biology, Chemistry or Physics.

Why you should choose KGV

With newly refurbished, spacious subject specific laboratories, our facilities enable students to really understand what it's like to be a scientist. With specialist teachers who are passionate about the endless possibilities within the world of science, you are guaranteed to be inspired every day. In addition, during the second year, our teachers will tailor the modules to your individual interests, allowing you to gain further knowledge into your preferred subject area.

What you will study

The Applied Science course is equivalent to one A-Level and is both exam and coursework based, with content from all three sciences. Over the two years, you will study units that develop your knowledge and understanding of key concepts in science and how they are applied in the medical, healthcare, food, chemical and pharmaceutical industries. There is also lots of practical work, to reinforce your knowledge and develop practical skills suitable for the real world!

University destinations and potential careers

Applied Science alongside another science A-Level will give you a great advantage when starting your career in the science industry.

Biology

Grade 6 in Biology (or a 66 in Combined Science) and a Grade 5 in Maths.

Biology A-Level is a dynamic and exciting subject that provides insight into many aspects of our modern world. We investigate and learn about a wide range of topics that include cells, membranes, transport systems, disease, immunity, biodiversity, physiological regulation, genetics and ecosystems. The course gives you a solid foundation for a wide variety of university courses and career paths. What's more, you will receive training in a host of practical biology skills which allow you to achieve a separate practical endorsement as well.

Chemistry

Additional entry requirements:
Grade 6 in Chemistry (or a 66 in Combined Science)
and a Grade 6 in Maths.

Chemistry is a fascinating subject that investigates how and why chemical phenomena occur. As you delve deeper, you will build your problem solving skills and enhance your understanding of the world around you. Regular experiments develop your practical skills and ensure your understanding of how chemistry is applied.

Why you should choose KGV

Our supportive, experienced teachers tailor each lesson to their individual students; so you can broaden your understanding and realise your potential from day one. Our fantastic facilities and advanced, spacious labs mean you have the best equipment at your fingertips and give you a realistic experience of working in the chemical industry.

What you will study

Chemistry is such a varied subject that no two lessons are the same. Some are entirely investigative and others allow you to use problem solving and arithmetic skills to explore high level chemistry concepts.

We delve into the world of organic chemistry to understand the way that atoms and electrons behave on the molecular level and also study inorganic chemistry looking at the reactions these colourful complexes can undergo.

As we explore these phenomena, we will not only be concerned with what reactions are taking place, but also at the conditions needed for these reactions and how they can be manipulated to give the most desirable outcomes.

University destinations and potential careers

A-Level chemistry is essential if you want to become a doctor, surgeon or dentist and is also recommended for those wanting to become a vet.

Achieving a good grade demonstrates to potential employers you have a logical mind and are able to solve complex problems. A good comprehension of physics helps to develop new technologies and understand our place in the universe.

Sport

Standard entry requirements:
Two GCSEs at Grade 5 and three GCSEs at Grade 4
including English Language.

Whether you choose an A-Level Equivalent or BTEC Extended Diploma, studying Sport at KGV can open up a wealth of opportunities. The sports industry contributes billions of pounds each year to the UK economy and is a continuously growing sector. The industry employs more than 400,000 people in areas such as health, fitness, leisure, outdoors, wellbeing, elite performance, coaching, teaching and media.

Sport A-Level Equivalent

The Pearson BTEC Level 3 National Extended Certificate in Sport is equivalent to one A-Level. It allows you to cover the fundamentals of the sports sector alongside other fields of study.

You will be taught by expert staff who also work for the awarding body as examiners/moderators and will have the opportunity to join college teams and compete in regional and national tournaments.

It will enable you to develop the essential skills required for gaining employment, securing career progression, or progressing to the further qualifications and training required to achieve your goals.

Some of the units that you will study include, Principles of Anatomy & Physiology in Sport, Sports Coaching, Assessing Risk in Sport and Fitness Training & Programming. The majority of modules are examined by our teachers, however some of them will be externally assessed.

Uniformed Protective Services

Standard entry requirements:
One GCSE at Grade 4 and two GCSEs at Grade 3 including maths or English.

This one-year programme provides an introduction to the public services and the important role they play within society. You will learn about different services, explore potential career opportunities and consider how public service organisations respond to the needs of individuals and communities.

Animal Management

Standard entry requirements:
One GCSE at Grade 4 and two GCSEs at Grade 3 including maths or English.

Level 2 Animal Management has been developed in consultation with employers in the animal care sector to ensure it enables learners to develop the skills and behaviours that will give them the best opportunity to be successful when applying for work.

As well as fabulous theory sessions, you will get hands-on with all the creatures in our Animal Unit, including small mammals such as rabbits and rodents, plus lizards, snakes and invertebrates.

You will also take part in 75 hours of work placement over the year, in an animal setting. Our students have enjoyed placements ranging from aviaries to cattle farms, gaining exciting and valuable work experience alongside their studies.
